- Receive coaching, guidance and mentorship from the women's leadership network of Eisenhower Fellowships.
- Participate in three to four virtual sessions with your peers from another country. They will be open, constructive and facilitated dialogues on topics relevant to female empowerment, skill development, education, career planning and personal development.
- Complete online assignments to build skills, including language and cultural exchange, collaborative projects, and discussions on various academic and extracurricular subjects.
- At the end of the program, you and your peers will elect a representative to present your collaborative project to a wider audience of peers. Upon completion, you will receive a certificate and can add the program to your CV.
